

# Free School Meals & Pupil Premium

## What is the Pupil Premium Grant?

The Pupil Premium Grant (or PPG) is a payment made to schools by the Department for Education that forms part of our annual school budget. It is intended to support the achievement and welfare of those young people eligible for free school meals and those who have one or more parents serving in the Armed Forces.

## Is your child eligible?

Not all children who are eligible for the PPG experience underperformance in terms of attainment or achievement at school. However, their need for personal, pastoral or for enhanced educational access can be addressed through use of Pupil Premium. ## Background

The Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011 and the amount has increased to £1,300 per pupil. Since announcing the Pupil Premium, the Government has extended its reach to cover any child that has been registered for Free School Meals in the past six years (this is known as the 'Ever 6' model). From September 2014 children who have been adopted from Care also are entitled to Pupil Premium funding.

## Accountability

National school performance tables will now include information about the progress of pupils in receipt of the PPG. From September 2012 Ofsted will survey the use of Pupil Premium money in schools when making their inspections. Also from September 2012 schools must publish information to parents about how Pupil Premium funding has been used and what impact it has had on pupil progress.

## How Our School Uses The Pupil Premium Grant

The Pupil Premium is intended to be spent on those pupils who attract it. However, as the school best understands the needs of its pupils, the funds are allocated at the discretion of the Governors and Senior Leadership team.

Our tracking and monitoring systems are designed to ensure that all students attain to their potential and we place a particular focus on tracking the progress of all of our students.

## The Support and Impact of PPG Spending 2016-17

£12,000	<p><b>To raise attainment at year 6</b> The progress and attainment of children with the PPG was higher than in 2016. Progress in reading of 0.05, writing -1.08 and maths 0.19 and attainment of reading of 64%, writing 45% and maths 64%</p>
£50,000	<p><b>To support progress in all year groups through quality, targeted interventions, including Same Day interventions</b> The progress of children across all year groups was strong, with pupil premium children in year 6 making progress above national.</p>
£12,000	<p><b>To continue the effective phonic and reading interventions in year 1 &amp; 2</b> The number of disadvantaged children achieving the phonics standard was above the national at 80% (national 70%).</p>
£20,000	<p><b>Emotional support through mentoring and counselling</b> Children were supported to be in school and able to access an appropriate curriculum</p>
£5,000	<p><b>Reception Speech and Language support</b> The number of children entitled to the PPG in Reception reaching a GLD (78%) was higher than in 2016 and above national</p>
£5,000	<p><b>Monitor and champion the progress of PP children</b> Termly reports of the progress of children entitled to the PPG show clear progress towards targets</p>
